

## 23 May 2024: Making Biodiversity Net Gain work for your farm business

# With visit to Hendred Farm Partnership

Heard about <u>Biodiversity Net Gain</u> (BNG) and want to learn more about its practical application in a local farm business? Then join us at Top Buildings, Newbury Road, East Hendred, OX12 8LG to hear from OCFC member Julian Gold about how the <u>Hendred Farm Partnership</u> is fitting BNG into farming operations to generate income from less productive land parcels.

Julian has a wealth of experience, having 6.1 ha in a 25 year voluntary BNG scheme and a further 14 ha planned for a 30 year mandatory BNG scheme, yielding a mixture of lowland calcareous grassland, neutral grassland and mixed native woodland biodiversity BNG units for sale. Julian will take us on a tour of the BNG area on the farm. We will also be joined by BNG expert Karen Lindley, from Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment BNG team, who sell Habitat Bank BNG Units to developers.
